Introducing our new Choirmaster

Dr. Nelly Maude Case will join the staff at Trinity on the Hill as Choirmaster in late August. As a fourth-generation professional church musician, she has over 35 years of combined experience as organist, vocal choir director, and hand bell choir director at Episcopal, Congregational, and Unitarian churches in Connecticut, Massachusetts, and New York. She also taught for 25 years in the Theory, History, and Composition Dept. at the Crane School of Music of the State University of New York in Potsdam. She and her husband, Dr. Stephen Ledoux, retired to Los Alamos in July of 2016. They have two grown children—daughter Susannah in Boston and son Miles, who resides here now, too. Since her retirement to New Mexico, Nelly has kept active musically as a violist in the Roswell Symphony Orchestra and by substituting on the organ and piano at Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran Church and the Los Alamos Unitarian Church. In addition to playing the violin in the Los Alamos Symphony Orchestra, she was elected to the Board of LASO this spring and is a member of the recorder group at the Senior Center.







Vienna Waits for You (and Me)

In his song, “Vienna”, singer-songwriter Billy Joel uses the city of Vienna as a metaphor for the rest of one’s life. Joel explains in a New York Times interview that he saw Vienna as a city of geographical, cultural, and political crossroads, as well as a city where even the very elderly found purpose to their days. Thus, “Vienna waits for you” is a reminder that “Life waits for you”, despite the crossroads you may encounter and regardless of your age.*



When I moved to Vienna, Austria, in October 2015 to join my husband Tom who was there on a change of station from LANL, I had no idea how *a propos* Billy Joel’s metaphor would become. In Vienna, I have had the privilege to do all you might expect that is associated with living in a major European capital: enjoy amazing people, culture, travel, sights, and food. Prior to moving, though, I sensed that God was also sending me to Vienna with an opportunity to step back from the

demands of my busyness and think about what in Life awaited me (besides apple strudel). I am so very grateful that He did. I entered a season of immense spiritual growth and after much prayer, study, and encouragement from others, found myself discerning God was calling me to ordained ministry as a vocational deacon.

In August 2016, I began the diocesan discernment process with an interview with Fr. Chris, whose discernment that I may have a calling officially made me an “Aspirant”. Since then, I spent over a year meeting periodically with a discernment committee at Christ Church, Vienna, consisting of my chaplain and five members of the congregation. I then returned to the U.S. in January of this year for two weekend retreats of extensive interviews with Bishop Vono and fifteen members of the Bishop’s Advisory Committee on Commission to the Ministry. This past May, after additional screening and paperwork, and with the support of TOTH’s vestry, I became a “Postulant”. I will begin three years of study at the IONA School for Ministry (a non-residential program) when I return to Los Alamos in September.

I am meanwhile enjoying my last months in the lovely city of Vienna, where I am surrounded by the vibrant crossroads of culture, art, ethnicity, politics, and religion that Billy Joel found so appealing. I look forward to returning to Los Alamos and sharing with you further about the diaconate, as well as listening to your own stories of calling and personal “Viennas”. I feel so incredibly blessed by the love and care of two very different congregations that nurture and support my journey. Please keep me in your prayers.




This is Romper the Otter (above). He was lovingly constructed and painted during VBS this year. Look out for him again later this year in the downtown Scarecrow Contest !
