Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who liveth and reigneth in glory with thee and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

People **It is meet and right so to do.**

Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant proceeds with the Eucharistic Prayer

The people then join in the Sanctus.

**Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts:
Heaven and earth are full of thy Glory.
Glory be to thee, O Lord Most High.
Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Then the Celebrant continues the prayer.

The Celebrant then invites all to join in the Lord's Prayer.
