SCHOOL SUPPLIES NEEDED FOR REFUGEE STUDENTS

Interfaith Los Alamos, for the fifth year in a row, is requesting that the very generous folks of Los Alamos consider once again donating backpacks loaded with school supplies for newly arrived refugee students. This year there will be about 150 refugee students starting in Albuquerque public schools **next week**, including boys and girls ages K-12.

The organization that resettles immigrants and refugees in the State of New Mexico, Lutheran Family Services, has once again reached out and asked for our help. They say that the donations from Los Alamos are most helpful because they are backpacks already loaded with supplies and ready for school. The specific need is for new backpacks each loaded with the required age-appropriate school supplies. **We have a collection box here at TOTH.**

We have a full list of the school supplies in the TOTH office and posted today in the narthex. Take a picture of the list with your phone! The deadline for donations is August 21.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,

and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again

in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the People

The Leader and People pray responsively

In peace, we pray to you, Lord God.

Silence

Leader: Let us say together the prayer for rain.

People: O God, heavenly Father, who by your Son Jesus Christ has promised to all those who seek your kingdom and its righteousness all things necessary to sustain their life: Send us, we entreat you, in this time of need, such moderate rain and showers, that we may receive the fruits of the earth, to our comfort and to your honor.

Leader: O God, whose love encircles us; sustain those who respond as wildfires roar, keep them safe from harm and hold them in thy sheltering embrace so that they may complete these burdensome tasks, return home to their families.

People: Keep their lives and the lives of all whom they protect safe from harm.

Leader: We pray that you look with loving-kindness on the people of Ukraine, as they struggle to live their lives in time of great uncertainty and fear. Grant that the goals of those who would terrorize and intimidate the people of Ukraine may continue to be thwarted,

People: and that in these times of trouble all people, of every faith, race and ethnicity may be drawn yet more closely in bonds of shared amity, respect, and purpose.

Leader: We pray that in this time of strife the evil we oppose will not turn us from our purpose to achieve peace, unity and concord among the nations of the earth, and we raise our prayers -

People: For all who work for justice, freedom, and peace.

Leader: For all people in their daily life and work;

People: For our families, friends, and neighbors, and for those who are alone.

Leader: For the just and proper use of your creation;

People: For the victims of hunger, fear, injustice, and oppression.

Leader: For all who are in danger, sorrow, or any kind of trouble;

People: For those who minister to the sick, the friendless, and the needy.

Leader: For the peace and unity of the Church of God;

People: For all who proclaim the Gospel, and all who seek the Truth.

Leader: For Michael, our Presiding Bishop, Michael, our Bishop, and for all bishops and other ministers;

People: For all who serve God in his Church.

Leader: For the special needs and concerns of this congregation, especially for Sally Cassil, Keith Stephens, Jerry Dick, Mary and Bill Ogle, Mary Cunningham,....

Silence (The People may add their own petitions)

Leader: Hear us, Lord;

People: For your mercy is great.

Leader: We thank you, Lord, for all the blessings of this life.

Silence (The People may add their own thanksgivings)

Leader: Hear Us, Lord.

People: And assist us in being grateful for all we have by your gracious will.

Leader: We ask your blessing on all who celebrate their birthdays and anniversaries this week, especially Paul Pope, Tom Burr, Amelia Kirkland, Mark Hunsinger, and Ruth and Joe Cox;

People: May they be blessed beyond measure.

Leader: We will exalt you, O God our King;

People: And praise your Name for ever and ever.

Leader: We pray for all who have died, especially James Aplington, Dianne Marquez, ... that they may have a place in your eternal kingdom.

Silence (The People may add their own petitions)

Leader: Lord, let your loving-kindness be upon them;

People: Who put their trust in you.

Leader: Let us also pray for our transition.

People: Look graciously on your Church of Trinity on the Hill, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a rector for this parish, and the hearts of priests who may be called to this Parish, that we may receive a faithful pastor, who will care for your people and equip us for our ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect

O Lord our God, accept the fervent prayers of your people; in the multitude of your mercies, look with compassion upon us and all who turn to you for help; for you are gracious, O lover of souls, and to you we give glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

The Deacon or Celebrant says

We pray to you also for the forgiveness of our sins.

A moment of Silence may be kept.

All say together

God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves, and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that enslaves us, the evil we have done, and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore, and strengthen us through our Savior Jesus Christ, that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. Amen.

The Celebrant concludes with an absolution.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

The Celebrant continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh. For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into right-eousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember Christ's death,

We proclaim Christ's resurrection,

We await Christ's coming in glory;

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Savior of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of

the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, through whom we are acceptable to you, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your children; through Jesus Christ our Savior, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **AMEN**.

At the conclusion of the prayer, the Celebrant invites everyone to join in the Lord's Prayer.

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread.


A period of silence is kept.


