The promise to the fore bearers

People: And blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.






People Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.



Through the Week

- Look up the following verses with your family. Write them on sticky notes or index cards.
 - o Romans 8:28

- You could also find other verses that remind you to trust God's plan.
- If your child made the "Reminder Sheep" craft, you can add the cards from that craft as well.
- Hang the notes around a door frame you'll all walk through often—your front door or a bathroom door, for example.
- Whenever you walk through that door, remember how God did what was best for the Israelites when he kept them safe and how God wants what's best for you.
