

The Holy Gospel: Luke 2:1-20 (from the King James Bible)

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

ISAIAH: Come on, Mr Know-it-all. Remember that I said "Nations will be drawn to your light, and Kings to the dawning of your new day". And as he grows up, you will also remember many other things that I said, like "he was despised and rejected, a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief" and "because of our sins he was wounded". But that is in the future. For now, rejoice, and accept God's glorious gift to the whole world.

GABRIEL AND JEHOSOPHAT: Yes! let's have a song!

CENTURION: Can I join in? **GABRIEL:** Of course you can!
